

## center twist



Take a one- or one-and-a-half-inch triangle close to the hairline and twist it several times; lay it on top of your head and push the roots forward. Lock it in place with two crisscrossing bobby pins. A little pomade on the ends or a spritz of shine spray, and it's done—an easy, cute look.

## the side clip



A pretty clip and a deep part take the focus away from your bangs. The trick to getting barrettes to stay in is to put bobby pins in underneath—and lots of product, says Crawford. "Starting with wet hair, smooth grooming cream in and pin it down with crossed bobby pins to anchor the hair in place, then put the barrette or brooch on top." In terms of products, Crawford's a big fan of layering: "Mousse at the roots gives you body, styling cream worked all through gives you control without stiffness, pomade on the ends adds texture, and oil and gloss on top separate hair and bump up shine," he says. "You can combine all of them if you use dime-size amounts. They'll help the clips stay in place."
