Hot Half-Up Hair

J.Lo has out-tressed herself—again. To steal her effect, comb mousse through damp strands, then blow-dry, says Renato Campora, who did her do. He used Kérastase Mousse Nutri-Sculpt, \$29. Set your locks in large hot rollers. After 20 minutes, unravel them and gather the top half into a sleek, high ponytail. Wrap a small section of hair around the base of the ponytail and secure it with a pin. Finish by running a styling cream over the rest of your coif to keep it smooth.

Sexy Streaks for Your Face Shape

Color Tips

Take the mold of your mug into consideration when highlighting the front of your hair, says Marie Robinson, colorist at Sally Hershberger Downtown in NYC. The scoop:



LONG AND NARROW

If your strands are past your shoulders, brighten up the bottom few inches a bit more to break up the length and make your face look shorter.



ROUND

Minimize your cheeks by keeping the streaks away from your hairline. Instead, add lowlights up front. They'll cast a slimming shadow.



SQUARE

Placing a few ¼-inch extra-light streaks around your hairline will soften the sharp angles around your face.



HEART

Since dark pieces by your chin can exaggerate any pointiness, be more liberal with the highlights by your jawline.

Tame Your Mane
If you're frizz-prone, don't rinse out all of your conditioner, says celebrity stylist Ted Gibson. The extra moisture will help to prevent puffiness.
